DELYTH

In early June our director in Anhui Province received an urgent call from an orphanage director. He had taken in a new baby who was extremely blue and failing to thrive. The tiny girl was estimated to be four months old, but she only weighed 3 kg. "Could you possibly help her?" he asked.

Our medical team moved little Delyth immediately to the Hefei Cardiac Hospital, where she was diagnosed as having several heart defects. Her surgery went very smoothly, but following the operation it became clear that Delyth was still struggling to survive. She would not eat, and her breathing was labored. We knew that she could not be returned at that time to an orphanage setting.

Thankfully we had an open bed at our Heartbridge Healing Home outside of Beijing, and Delyth was placed into the loving care of our nannies there. Her transformation began. Within a month after receiving special formula for underweight babies, her cheeks began to fill out. By December Delyth had gained over 4 kg. She could now sit up and interact with the other children.

All of Delyth's follow-up exams on her heart have gone well, and she will soon be discharged into foster care. Her life was saved because of the compassion and kindness of our supporters... and her story of hope has just begun.



ANNA

Anna entered our education program at the Jinjiang orphanage in Fujian Province in February 2011. When she first arrived to the orphanage, she was a very scared and sad little girl. Becoming orphaned as an older child is of course terrifying in many ways.

Our teachers worked each day to provide Anna with safety, structure, and caring compassion. They were instrumental in giving this dear girl a new sense of belonging and security.

In six short months little Anna is blossoming. She has learned poetry and songs; experienced science; and worked on colors, numbers, and writing. She loves to engage with her friends at school and has found a safe place to learn, grow, and truly begin to thrive. It is such a joy to see her learning to trust again.

All of us at LWB continually remember that each child in our programs is a priceless individual, coming into our hands with his or her own unique needs.

No two children have the exact same story, and so we try our very best to provide the assistance needed to each young person through our many program areas.

... and each child deserves someone to believe in her dreams.

MEDICAL CARE

Providing essential medical care to children who are sick remains at the very heart of LWB's mission. The need for our help intensified in 2011, as the number of babies being abandoned with birth defects continued to grow. Orphanages call us almost daily about babies found with critical medical needs and about children requiring more complex surgery than local hospitals can handle. Our medical program helps orphaned children with cleft lip and palate, heart defects, prematurity, spinal tumors, orthopedic issues, and a wide variety of general surgery needs. Our Unity Fund program, for children living in extreme poverty, grew substantially in 2011. This project helps rural families stay united by providing healing for their children that they could never afford.



In 2011, 152 children received surgeries or treatments for medical conditions. An additional 150 children were evaluated or monitored through our follow-up process. Our medical program worked in 12 provinces and helped children from 46 orphanages.



EDUCATION

We believe every child has the right to learn. In 2011 we continued to work to remove barriers for children who otherwise would not receive an education. LWB served 308 students from 22 cities in China.

LWB's Believe in Me schools are built inside of orphanages for those children who cannot attend public school. In 2011 we opened our sixth Believe in Me school inside the Changzhi orphanage in Shanxi Province. Nearly 200 orphaned children had their lives enriched through these schools last year. LWB held an education training for all of the teachers in our Believe in Me schools in February where experts in the field of special education traveled from the

U.S. to China to lead trainings in speech development, overcoming disabilities, the importance of art and creativity, and many other subject areas.

LWB began a new rural education project in 2011, helping children living in extreme poverty. The goal of our education program's Sunflower Project is to help these students achieve their dreams of going to high school and college, empowering them to improve their own lives and then ultimately their communities. Thirty-two students from Anhui, Fujian, Guangdong, and Hunan Provinces are part of this important project.

HEALING HOMES

As our medical work in China has grown, it became clear that many abandoned babies require more intensive care than they can receive in an orphanage setting. Our healing homes program takes in vulnerable children and provides them with a warm and safe environment to find the healing they need. Many babies come to us in a failure to thrive condition or severely underweight. In 2011 we continued our operation of the below four homes, which are always full to capacity.

- The Henan Healing Home, dedicated to babies born with cleft lip
- The Anhui Healing Home, helping babies with cleft, prematurity, and heart defects
- The True Children's Healing Home, helping babies with a wide variety of medical needs
- Our Heartbridge Healing Home, in partnership with the New Hope Foundation, which provides the most intensive care to medically fragile children



These crucial homes are truly life-saving. This year we took in many children who were critically ill and helped them receive a second chance.

One hundred fourteen children were helped in our healing homes in 2011, from 41 orphanages across 11 provinces.

ORPHANAGE ASSISTANCE

LWB has been helping orphanages with the essential daily supplies they need for children's health and safety since our work began. We provide items such as warm coats, new cribs, blankets, play equipment, and quality formula. In 2011, 100 orphanages in 22 provinces received assistance.

Supplemental nutrition programs were continued in ten orphanages across China, and we worked in partnership with the HuaQiao Foundation and Heinz Corporation to provide micronutrient supplements to orphaned children in two provinces. We also began an older child nutrition program for the Huainan orphanage in Anhui, helping 75 school aged children get much needed protein and additional nutrition.

LWB continued providing additional caregivers for the Pingliang and Shantou orphanages, as well as providing medical staff to two orphanages in Anhui.





FOSTER CARE

Love Without Boundaries believes that every child deserves a family of his or her own, and our commitment to providing quality foster care is stronger than ever. We are one of the only groups in China who visit the children in our foster care programs each and every month. This allows our local managers to really get to know the children and families and helps us to better serve the individual needs of each child. LWB helped 316 orphaned children have their very own family through foster care this year, and we celebrated that 62 of those children found permanent homes through adoption. Several were adopted by the families who were fostering them!

In 2011 we established new foster care programs with three orphanages in the more rural regions of China – Liuzhi and Qiandongnan in Guizhou Province and Changzhi in Shanxi Province – bringing our total number of foster care locations to 18. We also began a new nutrition initiative for all the children in our program under the age of 24 months, supplying babies with fortified rice cereal to encourage proper weaning and better oral motor skills. We are grateful to everyone who helped support our foster care program as we believe it provides lifelong benefits to orphaned children when they can experience love and security in a family environment.

CLEFT CARE

A dream came true for our foundation in 2011. Since our beginning we have had a passion to help babies abandoned with cleft lip have the best chance possible of a healthy life. Children with cleft all over the world often struggle with feeding issues, as they are unable to suck properly due to the opening in their lip and palate. Specialized cleft bottles, which are soft and easy to squeeze, can help a baby feed more easily. Unfortunately these specialized bottles have not been available in China. For over a decade couriers have hand-carried these specialized bottles to orphanages, but, with so many tiny babies being abandoned with cleft, the need has always been greater than the supply – with often tragic results.

In 2011, thanks to the help of Mead Johnson Nutritionals and the Joint Council on International Children’s Services, LWB was finally able to source a manufacturer for cleft bottles in China and place an order for over 12,000 bottles. In addition we created cleft feeding training materials for orphanages in both print form and DVD. In the final months of the year, in combined effort with the China Center for Child Welfare and Adoption, life-saving bottles and training materials were sent to every government orphanage in China.

PHYSICAL THERAPY

One of the biggest challenges of China's orphanage system today is providing ongoing physical and occupational therapy to children born with conditions such as cerebral palsy. Almost every orphanage we work with has asked for additional training on how to best care for these beautiful children. Our commitment to their care continued in 2011 with another provincial training provided by therapists from the U.S. This year's training was held in Guizhou Province, and the therapists traveled and evaluated children in Beijing, Anhui, and Fujian Provinces as well. Nearly 100 children were seen and evaluated on this trip. In addition children in many orphanages received essential adaptive equipment, such as wheelchairs, walkers, and orthotics.



ADOPTION ADVOCACY

LWB believes so strongly that every orphaned child possible deserves the chance of a permanent family. Once again in 2011 several thousand children were placed on China's special needs adoption list. To help overcome the stigma surrounding the term "special needs," LWB continued its education work by maintaining and updating our www.adoptspecialneeds.org website. We also expanded our Waiting Child video series by creating a new video on the adoption of boys, who often wait far longer for families than girls. LWB offered ten adoption grants in 2011 for children who had been waiting a particularly long time for a home. Our blog at www.lwbcommunity.org continued to highlight children in our programs who were available for adoption, resulting in many children finding permanent homes! We also celebrated a marked increase in domestic adoption within China and give thanks that many of the children in our programs were adopted locally.



WORLDWIDE HELP



LWB Spain established the Believe in Me Changzhi School in Shanxi Province, which opened in September 2011.

LWB Spain had a wonderful year as they expanded their programs to establish the Believe in Me Changzhi School in Shanxi Province. They also continued their full support of the Tongren foster care program in Guizhou. We all celebrated when LWB Spain won a televised lip dub contest, with the proceeds going to help orphaned children born with cleft lip. Spain maintains their own website, blog, Twitter, and Facebook pages as well.

LWB branches in the Netherlands, United Kingdom, and Ireland continued their efforts to help orphaned children, and donations to bring aid to children in need arrived from 25 countries around the world.

LWB remains a passionate and committed volunteer ministry, and in 2011 we had over 185 volunteers from 13 countries working in our programs and watching over the children closely. We were excited to see more volunteers from within China and are grateful to our staff there for continually looking for ways for local citizens to get involved in orphan care.

TEAM LWB

TeamLWB (www.TeamLWB.com) is a program that allows individuals to make a difference in the life of a child by creating or joining a fundraising event, such as a marathon, a 5K race or a walk. In 2011 Team LWB raised over \$60,000 for our orphanage assistance, medical, education and healing homes programs. The events included the Los Angeles Marathon, a half marathon in Long Branch, NJ, a 5K Walk in Cary, NC; the 5K Zoo Run in Brookfield, Ill., the Flora Mini-marathon in Ireland, the 5K Rebel Race in Frederick, MD, the Philadelphia Half Marathon and the Marine Corps Marathon, 10K and Kids Fun Run in Washington, DC.

FINANCIALS

Dear Friends and Supporters of LWB,

With a paused economy in the U.S., a debt crisis in Europe, and tragedies occurring in places like Japan, the world continued to struggle financially in 2011. While these macroeconomic factors continued to impact Love Without Boundaries, we are pleased to report that LWB did see moderate growth in contributions over the year. Total income was up 17% to \$1.8 million* for the year ended December 31. Our balance sheet remains strong with over \$900,000 in cash, cash equivalents and marketable securities. Encouragingly, we continue to expand globally, with donations coming in from over 25 countries.

Love Without Boundaries continues to expand globally, with donations coming in from over 25 countries.

Part of our success in 2011 was due in part to new and innovative ways our supporters raised funds. Our team at LWB Spain participated in, and ultimately won, a televised lip sync contest, bringing in about \$14,000 for the foundation. One of our key volunteers won a contest sponsored by Ford, and she raised \$15,000 by driving a Ford Focus 10,000 miles across the country and creating a video. We saw supporters ask for donations in lieu of their own wedding gifts, and one special young person sold her stuffed animals to raise funds. LWB

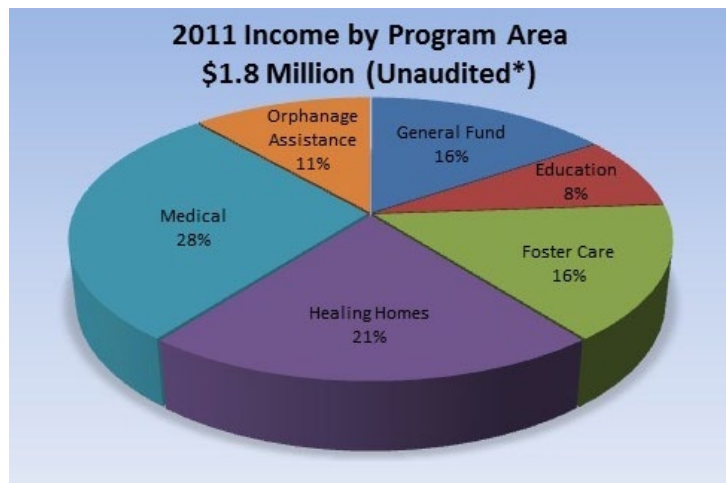
supporters also continued to fundraise through marathons and other races in places like Washington, D.C., Dublin, Los Angeles, and Philadelphia.

As 2011 remained challenging, the Board of LWB continued to focus on being fiscally prudent to ensure that appropriate funds were available for both our existing and new programs. While we remain cautious, we are cautiously optimistic, and understand that the need for our services has never been greater. As 2012 begins, the LWB Board will continue to seek out new ways to bring in funds to support our programs.

RICHARD

During a visit to China last October, our foster care directors met this sweet boy at an orphanage just three days after he had been abandoned. He was nearly nine years old and appeared to be carrying the weight of a crushed world on his tiny shoulders. His pain and loss were so apparent that our directors fell silent. He had an obvious weakness in his right leg, and, when questioned by the orphanage staff, he would answer each question in a soft, broken voice. A decision was made to move him into foster care as soon as possible in an attempt to start healing his hurting heart and spirit.

Richard has been with his foster family for nearly three months now. Although his progress was almost nonexistent the first two months as he grieved, we happily saw a glimpse of hope during his third month with his foster family.

Richard says that his foster grandpa is a wonderful cook who prepares him delicious meals. We purchased a new walking cane for him, and he now loves taking long walks with his foster grandpa and foster brother. Although Richard still has a very heavy heart, we are starting to see a glimmer of hope and smiles beginning to emerge. Richard has a long road ahead of him as he struggles to make sense of the events that have changed his life forever, but, with the love and support of a caring foster family, we know he will one day learn to trust in others again.
